That I have known Miss Judith Tyberg ever since she was born at Point Loma, California, May 16, 1902.

During this period of forty-six years, I have rarely met a more earnest, capable, high-minded and fine character than Judith Tyberg. From early childhood she showed her aptitude for study and learning. As she grew into young womanhood, she was entrusted with the care of children in the Râja-Yoga School, where we were both matriculated. In the pursuit of her collegiate studies, Miss Tyberg was outstanding. For many years she was one of the most capable teachers in the Râja-Yoga School and later became Director of Studies and Professor of Sanskrit and of Oriental Philosophy at Theosophical University.

Miss Tyberg's lectures were distinguished by wide reading and research; and even more than this, she imparted to her students and hearers the spiritual aroma and inspiration of the great philosophical schools of the East.
